



**Ralph J. Blincoe**  
Deputy Director for Management  
and Administration  
Naval Criminal Investigative Service

Ralph J. Blincoe was appointed as the Deputy Director for Management and Administration of the Naval Criminal Investigative Service in September 2007.

Prior to this appointment, Mr. Blincoe had served as the Deputy Director for Operations since January 2006. He held the position of Executive Assistant Director for NCIS Atlantic Operations in Norfolk, Virginia from August 2004 to December 2005. In the aftermath of the tragic events of September 11, 2001, he was appointed as the Agency's first Executive Assistant Director for Combating Terrorism. Mr. Blincoe was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in August 2003.



Mr. Blincoe joined the NCIS in 1982, serving as a special agent in the Naval Station San Diego, California Resident Agency. Since that initial assignment, Mr. Blincoe has served in numerous field positions in the criminal and counterintelligence disciplines in Hawaii, Washington, D.C., and Jacksonville, Florida. He served as the Supervisory Special Agent of the NCIS Resident Agency in Rota, Spain as well as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the NCIS Europe Field Office in Naples, Italy. He returned to Washington, D.C. in 1997 where he served as the Staff Assistant to the NCIS Director David Brant.

In March 1999, Mr. Blincoe was assigned as the NCIS Deputy Assistant Director for Crimes Against Persons, including responsibility for the NCIS Domestic Violence Unit and Cold Case Homicide Unit. Thereafter he served as the Special Agent in Charge of the Washington, D.C. Field Office.

A native of Charlottesville, Virginia, he attended Guilford College in Greensboro, North Carolina, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Administration of Justice. Mr. Blincoe has received several achievement awards from the Department of the Navy, Department of Defense and the Department of Justice, including the Navy Superior Civilian Service Award for his role in leading a missing persons' task force that was credited with saving the lives of two Navy officers.
