Franz Schwarm was born in Ukiah, California on September 15, 1944. He earned a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of California at Berkeley in 1966. Following graduation, he began his law enforcement career as a patrolman with the Berkeley Police Department and rose to the rank of sergeant before joining the U.S. Secret Service in 1971 as a Special Agent assigned to the San Francisco Field Office.

In 1974 Special Agent Schwarm was assigned to the Presidential Protective Division and served on protective details to President Gerald Ford and President Jimmy Carter. He was transferred to Secret Service Headquarters in 1979, where he served in the Forgery Division and the Special Investigations and Security Division until 1981 when he assumed duties as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the San Diego Field Office of the Secret Service.

In 1983 he was assigned to Secret Service Headquarters, where he served as a staff assistant until his appointment as Assistant Inspector in the Office of Inspection in 1991. He was transferred to the Headquarters Intelligence Division in 1989, where he served until 1991, when he became the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Washington Field Office. He returned to Secret Service Headquarters in August 1992 to become the Special Agent in Charge of Personnel and Staffing, and served in that position until June 1993, when he retired in order to accept a position with the Naval Criminal Investigative Service as the Assistant Director for Administration.

Special Agent Schwarm is a graduate of the Contemporary Executive Development Course at the George Washington University School of Business.
