Subj: Civilian Manpower Reductions FY 1969

1. Reference (a) contains end-strength control totals for the Naval Intelligence Command, which have been determined by the Office of Civilian Manpower Management (OCMM). The Fiscal Year 1969 total for all full-time permanent positions within this command, including reimbursable positions, is stated as 1,464. To this total must be added functional transfers which provide a net increase of 28 positions, to reach the currently approved end strength of 1,492.
2. The new controls require a reduction of 260 positions throughout the command below the total which appeared in the President's Budget. NIC-4, after consulting OCMM to learn the basis on which this total of 260 was based, has applied the reductions to the headquarters and field activities on the same basis. The new approved end strengths resulting from this action are shown on enclosure (1). The basis of the OCMM cut and the identification of the functional transfers involved are shown in an audit trail on enclosure (2). The new totals, by activity and by program element as shown on enclosure (1), have been incorporated into the Fiscal Year 1969 operating budgets now being distributed to addressees. They have also been incorporated into the Fiscal Year 1969 column of the Fiscal Year 1970 budget submission, which has been forwarded to the Navy Comptroller.
3. NIC-4 is aware that NIC-1 is currently determining the best distribution of available civilian ceiling points. When a final determination has been made, the Fiscal Year 1969 operating budgets will be adjusted.
