Subject: Proposed regulations covering the assignment of security-control responsibilities for industrial security.

Date: (a) OMM 1 Mar 1950 (b) 10 Mar 1950 to addressees

1. In reference (a) comment was requested in connection with the provisions of the subject proposed regulations. The comments of the Commandant of the Marine Corps are as follows:

a. It appears that, at the present time, the Marine Corps, as an agent of the Department of the Navy, could be assigned to or if any responsibilities dealing with these phases of industrial security involving the protection of classified military information to the benefit of United States industry.

b. It does appear, however, that the Marine Corps as an agent of the Department of the Navy could be assigned responsibility involving the plant protection phase of industrial security for up to 100 industrial installations in which the Marine Corps is currently designated as the Armed Services Emergency Planning Officer.

c. If the responsibilities described in paragraph (b) above were to be assumed in fact, and such responsibility were to be delegated to the Marine Corps for implementation, appropriate budgetary and personnel adjustments would be required. Existing requests for industrial mobilization funds for Marine Corps use are limited to actual funds to carry out the Marine Corps responsibility for plant inspection under the function "Plant Protection Allocation Program". Therefore no funds are included in Marine Corps budgets for fiscal years 1950, 1951, and 1952 which would provide for the assumption of any responsibility in connection with industrial security.
