Subject: TEXACO COMPANY

Information has been received by this Bureau that tankers of the Texaco Company are now operating one hundred miles from the Atlantic shore. At various times all men are suddenly given orders to go below deck and not to come up until the word is given. During this time the sound of the ship's engine indicates that fuel is being poured out.

The source of this information believes that this might possibly be a refueling of Nazi submarines.

These data are forwarded to you for your information and whatever action you may deem advisable.
