

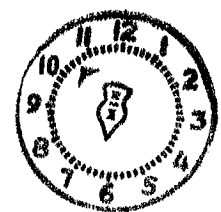

My dear Mr. Secretary: The description of this matter, reported for  
by the Secretary of War is not used.

The Navy Department has recently received a despatch from Rear Admiral Bloch, Commandant of the Fourteenth Naval District, comprising the Hawaiian group and adjacent islands, recommending that 6,000 male alien Japanese under fifty years of age and approximately 6,000 male Japanese American citizens under fifty who have attended school in Japan or performed military service for that Government, be deported to the mainland.

Aside from the problem of transporting this large number of men, the question arises as to their disposition upon arrival on the California coast. It would not seem that these men would fall into the class of evacuated Japanese of all ages and both sexes from the military areas on the West Coast, for the consideration of which group the Director of Civilian Defense is forming an Interdepartmental Board. Rather, it would seem that these men should be in a status similar to that of the suspected aliens who have been arrested and placed in custody. It would appear that these deportees should be placed under custody in a restricted area or a concentration camp of some type.

It is understood that the War Department is undertaking the construction of concentration camp facilities for potentially dangerous aliens. I should appreciate information as to whether these facilities as now planned could receive these 12,000 men, if so deported from Hawaii, or if not, whether the War Department could expand the intended facilities in order to provide for this group.

The date when the War Department could begin receiving these men, and the rate at which they could be received, would also be of interest, in order that transportation problems could be adjusted to accord with this time and rate.

It is appreciated that at the present time legal authority exists for the deportation of the aliens only, but it is believed that under Executive Order No. 9066 of February 20, 1942, the deportation of Japanese American citizens can be authorized, if the Secretary of War or his delegate Military Commander should prescribe the Hawaiian Islands, or Oahu in particular, as a military area, and prohibit Japanese American citizens of

the description noted remaining therein. At the present time, however, pending complete consideration of this problem, request for such action by the Secretary of War is not made.
