Donald R. Bruce is a native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He attended Salem College in Salem, West Virginia, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in business administration in June 1972. He began his law enforcement career in September, 1973, as a member of the Uniformed Branch of the United States Secret Service, and joined the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) in August, 1974.

As the Special Agent in Charge (SAC) of the Far East Field Office located in Yokosuka, Japan, Special Agent Bruce is responsible for providing supervisory oversight of all NCIS criminal and security investigations and related activities from the Island of Japan, east to India and the Eastern coast of Africa, south to Antarctic and north to the North Pacific Ocean and west to the Northern Marianas Islands (Guam). He supervises over 90 special agents, intelligence operations specialists, investigators and approximately 36 administrative support staff personnel.

Special Agent Bruce joined NCIS in August, 1974, and served tours of duty at Alameda, California; as Special Agent Afloat on USS Coral Sea (CV-43); Okinawa, Japan; and Norfolk, Virginia. He served at NCIS Headquarters from June, 1984, to August, 1987, where he was the desk officer for Special Operations and Cooperating Witness Program and was subsequently the Division Head for the Crimes Against Person Division and Special Operations Division. He has held the position of Resident Agent in Charge at NCIS offices in Panama; Orlando, Florida; and Okinawa, Japan. He was appointed SAC of the Far East Field Office on July 18, 1994.

Special Agent Bruce is married to the former Dawn A. Chaderwick of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. They have one son, Chad, and one daughter, Jessica.
