Colonel Forquer enlisted in the Marine Corps in May 1978. After graduating from Marine Corps Recruit Training as the Platoon Honorman, he attended the U.S. Army Military Police Basic Course at Ft. McClellan, AL. Following school, then Private First Class Forquer served as a Military Policeman, Military Police Investigator, and SWAT member of the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, California.



After completing his undergraduate degree in Criminal Justice and Public Administration, Corporal Forquer was accepted to the Enlisted Commissioning Program. He attended the Marine Corps Officer Candidate School and was subsequently commissioned a Second Lieutenant.

Among Colonel Forquer's assignments were the Second Marine Division Military Police Company at Camp Lejeune; Aerial Observer/Instructor with Marine Observation Squadron One; Provost Marshal at Camp H.M. Smith, Hawaii; First Marine Division Military Police Company; Operations Officer and Deputy Provost Marshal at Camp Pendleton; the Joint Security Directorate at the U.S. Central Command in Tampa, FL; and Commander of "G" Company, Marine Security Guard Battalion, Abidjan, Cote D'Ivoire, West Africa.

In 1996 Major Forquer attended the FBI National Academy at Quantico, Virginia. In 2002 Lieutenant Colonel Forquer completed the Naval War College in Newport Rhode Island, and was awarded a Master's Degree in National Security and Strategic Studies.

In June 2003 Colonel Forquer was promoted to the rank of Colonel and served as the Vice Director, Strategy, Policy, and Plans, United States Southern Command, Miami, Florida until February 2006, when he joined NCIS as the Commanding Officer, NCIS Office of Military Support.
