



## Mr. H. Richard Holgate Executive Assistant Director for Information Technology and Command Information Officer Naval Criminal Investigative Service

Rick Holgate assumed responsibility as Assistant Director for Information Technology and Command Information Officer at the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) in June 2004. In March 2007, he was promoted to the position of Executive Assistant Director for Information Technology/ Command Information Officer, a new position established under an agreement with the Director of Naval Intelligence. In this capacity, he is responsible for: delivery of IT services to NCIS' 2,400+ employees worldwide; transition of NCIS to the Navy Marine Corps Intranet (NMCI); management of NCIS's application portfolio; IT strategy and planning; and integration of NCIS's information management needs with those of its collaborative counterparts across the Department of the Navy and Department of Defense, as well as other federal, state and local organizations.



Prior to joining NCIS, Mr. Holgate was employed as a Senior Manager with BearingPoint, Inc. During his eight years at BearingPoint, he fulfilled a variety of responsibilities including all aspects of project management, team management, and business development. His clients included many organizations across the Department of Defense. Within the Navy, he has worked with the Program Executive Officer for Information Technology (PEO-IT); the Director, Navy Staff; the Office of the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations (Logistics); Naval District Washington; the Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC); and the Office of Financial Operations (FMO).

Mr. Holgate also led a Zero-Based Review of NCIS's mission and activities in 2002, and has worked closely with the NCIS Modernization team, first as a contractor and now as Command Information Officer.

Prior to his work at BearingPoint, Mr. Holgate worked at the MITRE Corporation, where he supported the Air Force, Army, and intelligence community on issues related to, respectively: base realignment and closure and environmental restoration; chemical weapons demilitarization; and arms control verification.

Mr. Holgate is a certified Project Management Professional and is a member of the Project Management Institute, the Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association, the National Defense Industrial Association, the Navy League, the Naval Institute, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the American Chemical Society, and the American Institute of Chemical Engineers.
