Richard C. Machin is a native of DeKalb, Illinois. He enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1966 and served in Vietnam during the 1968 Tet Offensive. At the conclusion of his Marine Corps tour, he returned to Northern Illinois University. After graduation, he joined the Illinois State Police and served as a Trooper until 1973, when he became a Special Agent with the Naval Investigative Service, the predecessor of the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS).

Special Agent Machin's field office assignments have been at Great Lakes, Illinois; Okinawa, Japan; Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines; as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii; as the Special Agent in Charge at the Naval Submarine Base, New London, Connecticut; and as Deputy Director, NCIS Mid-Atlantic Region. His several tours at NCIS Headquarters have included assignments as the Deputy Director of the Criminal Investigations Directorate and as Executive Assistant to the Director of NCIS.

In July, 1993, Special Agent Machin was appointed to as Regional Director of the NCIS Eastern Region and served in that position until August, 1994, when he was appointed as Assistant to the Director of NCIS and Special Assistant for Law Enforcement Agency Liaison to the Commander-in-Chief U.S. Atlantic Command / Supreme Allied Command Atlantic.

Special Agent Machin is a member of the Senior Executive Service and a 1990 graduate of the Senior Executive Fellows Program at Harvard University.
