





Special Agent In Charge Los Angeles Field Office Naval Criminal Investigative Service

Rodney B. "Rod" Miller was born in Linton, Indiana, on July 8, 1948. He served four years with the U.S. Air Force, including a one-year assignment in Vietnam with the Military Assistance Command, Vietnam (MACV). He attended Indiana State University, where he earned both a bachelor of science degree and a masters degree in criminology.

Special Agent Miller joined the Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) in May, 1975, serving his initial tour of duty at Great Lakes, Illinois. Subsequent assignments included: Crane, Indiana; Guam; Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) at Portsmouth, Virginia; ASAC at Norfolk, Virginia; Special Agent in Charge (SAC) of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Fraud Unit in Norfolk; and the first SAC of the Operation "Illwind" Task Force, a joint NCIS-Federal Bureau of Investigation procurement fraud investigation in Washington, D.C. which later resulted in over 55 convictions and the over \$250 millions in fines, restitutions and recoveries.

In 1989, Special Agent Miller established the Los Angeles Regional Fraud Unit as the SAC, and in 1993 was appointed as the SAC of the newly established Los Angeles Field Office, encompassing seven counties in Southern California which includes several U.S. Navy and Marine Corps installations.

Special agent Miller and his wife, Christine, reside in Highland, California, with their three children.
