We train our more than 2,000 men and women at a host of state-of-the-art facilities and, through innovative programs, deploy them to support these military personnel. Multiple Threat Alert Center (MTAC)

A unique fusion center that merges intelligence from other agencies with information from NCIS' global law enforcement activities, the Multiple Threat Alert Center links counter terrorism, counterintelligence and intelligence data with cyber, criminal and security information.

Analysts, Special Agents and military personnel deployed to NCIS' MTAC work around the clock to identify possible terrorist activity, foreign intelligence threats and criminal pursuits that could affect Naval operations. Being assigned

to the MTAC allows you to live the multi-faceted demands of the NCIS mission – in real time.

Contingency Response Field Office (CRFO)

American military forces face threats more complex and dangerous than ever before. NCIS responds by rapidly deploying highly trained and specialized personnel to conduct criminal, counter terrorism and counterintelligence investigations and operations from our Contingency Response Field Office. As a Special Agent assigned to CRFO, you'll receive extensive training in NCIS' core mission areas, as well as tactics and techniques used in military and high-risk law enforcement operations.

Special Agent Afloat Program

NCIS works wherever members of the Navy and Marine Corps live and work — even at sea. The NCIS Special Agent Afloat Program deploys Special Agents aboard aircraft carriers and their strike groups to investigate felony crimes, provide guidance and advice on foreign counterintelligence and terrorist activities and ensure security. Agents who volunteer for this program will receive additional training to conduct general criminal investigations, crime scene examinations and interviews in this challenging and highly mobile environment.

Competitive candidates for Intelligence Analyst or Security Specialist positions must be U.S. citizens who possess a baccalaureate degree and are able to obtain and retain a Top Secret security clearance.

In addition, competitive applicants for Special Agent positions must be at least age 21 and no older than 37 at the time of hire, in excellent physical condition and in possession of a valid driver's license.
