Robert Michael "Bob" Nigro was born in Boston, Massachusetts, on February 20, 1952. He attended St. Anselm College in Manchester, New Hampshire, on an athletic grant-in-aid for ice hockey and earned a bachelor of science degree in criminal justice in 1974. He lettered all four years in ice hockey while he was at St. Anselm and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 1984.

As the Special Agent in Charge (SAC) of the Charleston Field Office, Special Agent Nigro is responsible for over 40 NCIS special agents assigned to seven offices located at Navy and Marine Corps facilities in South Carolina, Georgia and Panama.

He joined NCIS in 1974 and was initially assigned to the New London, Connecticut, Resident Agency. He served subsequent tours at NCIS offices in Yokosuka and Yokohama Japan; as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge at resident agencies in Oceana and Norfolk, Virginia Norfolk; and as SAC at resident agencies in Cherry Point, North Carolina, and Portsmouth, Virginia, and now Charleston, South Carolina. He has also served two afloat tours on USS Midway and USS Blue Ridge.

Special Agent Nigro is the recipient of several outstanding performance awards as well as the Department of the Navy Civilian Meritorious Medal for his role in resolving a situation involving armed and barricaded suspect, who later surrendered to NCIS special agents. He also received the Navy Unit Citation during his tenure in Yokosuka.

Special Agent Nigro is married to the former Michelle Gayer of Charlestown, Massachusetts. They have three children, Benjamin, Dustan, and Nicholas, and live in Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina.
