- (A) Chronology on subject matter for months of December, 1943 and January and February, 1944.
- (B) Report of Summary and Company Clearance Unit of B-7-A, 29 November, 1943 to 4 March, 1944.
- 1. Enclosure (A) was composed almost in its entirety from correspondence appearing in the B-7 Day File. It is by no means a complete account of correspondence for the period covered, nor does it include reference to every item which might be construed as having naval interest. Rather is it a bare mention of work done which has a direct and unmistakable naval interest.
- 2. Since the Day File does not reflect the sizeable amount of work done by Unit III of B-7-A having a high percentage of naval interest and in response to legitimate requests, enclosure (B) is also respectfully submitted.
- 3. Enclosure (A) is not set forth as mirroring anywhere near all of the work of Naval Interest done in B-7. However, it is felt that it might be of interest as a supplement to any general description of subject matter and it is believed that only by wading through such detail can one gain a proper appreciation of how many demands are made on the Section by how many branches of the Navy and related arms of the government and also of how much pressure the Section is able to bring to bear.
  - 4. It is believed that the chronology of the last three months

reference to the continuing task on transfer of registry of American vessels, there are many references to other outstanding jobs — repatriation, Merchant Marine Suspect and Barred Lists, service with and through the British and the functioning of the B-7-0 files as the premier source of information in the American government on Japanese and Japanese-Americans. The play-by-play report on the three months certainly shows that the work of the section is not on the decline, but is increasing.

- 5. A review of the record in the light of certain recent experiences leads to these conclusions:
  - a. The vast majority of the work done in the section is in response to requests that cannot be ignored; that is, some office within the Navy Department must handle them.
  - b. Information on file cannot be handed out like a plate of beans by the unitiated, nor can just any group maintain the files.
  - c. The recent decimation of MIS can be expected to result in increased demands on ONI for counter-intelligence information and there is evidence that the Army itself will call on ONI for more and more service, as witness the request for processing some 8,000 Japanese-Americans to be drafted. It might be added parenthetically that the disruption of MIS apparently has brought confusion within the Army as to how counter-intelligence information is to be obtained requests addressed direct to ONI have come in from a number of Army field offices.
  - d. Branches of the Navy within the continental limits and outside them would be in a sad way for counter-intelligence without the services of the S.E.C. Section. In the absence of any help from MIS, they would have to turn to FBI and experience has shown that time enough for the planning and fighting of major battles can elapse before replies are received from FBI to routine requests from the Navy.




