CAPTAIN JACK O. JOHNSON, USNR February 1966 - July 1966

Captain Johnson received his commission in August 1941. He reported to the District Intelligence Office, Tenth Naval District, followed by a tour of duty with Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron 32 in the Pacific. In June 1946, Captain Johnson received his LLB from the University of Florida College of Law. He practiced law in Palm Beach County from 1946 until 1950. He is a member of the Florida Bar, and eligible to practice before the U. S. District Court (Florida) and the U. S. Supreme Court. Upon his return to active duty in July 1950, Captain Johnson became Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Amphibious Group FOUR. He was then ordered to report to Hawaii as Assistant District Intelligence Officer and Assistant Chief of Staff (Intelligence). Captain Johnson reported to Washington in 1955 as Head, Investigations Branch, Office of Naval Intelligence. He was then ordered back to the West Coast as Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, U.S. Naval Defense Force Eastern Pacific and Western Sea Frontier. Upon returning to Washington, Captain Johnson served as action officer on the staff of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. He then assumed the duties of Assistant Director of Naval Intelligence (Counterintelligence) followed by assignment as the Director, Naval Investigative Service.
