CAPTAIN JAMES H. BARTHOLOMEW, USN 1983 -1984

Captain James H Bartholomew graduated from Penn State University in 1954 with a degree in forestry. He received his commission from OCS Newport, RI, in July 1955 as an Air Intelligence Officer (1355 designator). After receiving photographic interpretation training in Washington, DC, he was assigned to the Fleet Air Intelligence Augmentation Unit Pacific in Hawaii until September 1958, followed by a tour at the Navy Photographic Interpretation Center in Washington, DC. He was then ordered in September 1960 to the Joint Strategic Targeting Planning Staff at Offutt AFB with the first navy group assigned to that command. He then spent three years on the staff of Commander Seventh Fleet between 1962 and 1965, followed by a two-year tour as CNO operations briefer. He was then on the staff of NAVFORVIETNAM between February 1967 and April 1968, and then returned for two years to BUPERS as an Intelligence Assignment Officer. This was followed by a tour as XO of the Naval Investigative Service Office Philadelphia. The next three years were spent as head of CNO Intelligence Plot until January of 1975 when he was ordered to the Office of the Secretary of Defense as a General Defense Intelligence Program (GDIP) Program and Budget Officer. Between 1977 and 1979 he was Assistant Commander Naval Intelligence Command for Resource Management. Then he became Deputy Director of Naval Intelligence for Plans, Policy and Estimates. Prior to his assignment as Commander, Naval Investigative Service Command, he was Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, CINCPACFLT Staff.
