- 1. This directive was issued by the National Security Council pursuant to the National Security Act of 1947.

- The Office of Naval Intelligence has pledged its word to the CIA not only that it would do nothing to contravene CIA's operation in this field but also that if we in the Navy had assets which were not being exploited at the present time, we would work closely with CIA in exploiting those assets. In this connection it is important to remember that the Navy is not repeat not in competition with the CIA in this field.
