Graduating from the United States Naval Academy in 1946, Captain Barney Martin, United States Navy, performed cruiser duty with the Atlantic Fleet prior to qualifying as a U. S. Naval Aviator in 1949. His aviation duties consisted of assignments with Air Development Squadron TWO, Electronic Countermeasures Squadron ONE, and the Naval Air Station, Pensacola. In late 1955 Captain Martin was designated Special Duty Officer (Naval Intelligence) and reported in 1956 to the Office of Naval Intelligence. Subsequently, he has held positions as Assistant Naval Attache, Paris; Head, Attache Branch, ONI; Personal Aide to the Chief of Naval Operations; Assistant Chief of Staff, Intelligence, Commander Sixth Fleet; Commander, Task Force 157, and as Military Assistant/ Management Analyst on the staff of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Intelligence). He has served as Director, Naval Investigative Service since 29 June 1973.

Captain Martin is a graduate of the Naval Intelligence School, has been a student at the Navy School, Anacostia, for Spanish and French languages, and in 1968 attended the Senior Officers' Executive Management Course, Naval War College. Captain Martin wears the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal, and various campaign ribbons.

Captain Martin is married to the former Virginia Wheeler of Medina, Ohio, and they live in Tantallon, Maryland.

Captain Lewis Edward Connell joined the Naval Reserve in 1948. He was called to active duty after graduation from the University of Texas and attended class number two of the newly formed Officers Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island, being commissioned Ensign in March of 1952. He attended Air Intelligence School in Washington, D. C., and became Intelligence Officer of the USS Point Cruz (CVE 119) and the embarked squadron, VS 892. He then attended Photo Interpretation School and was attached to the Ninth Naval District as Assistant District Intelligence Officer (Air). He was assigned to the Fleet Air Intelligence Augmenting Unit. Pacific. from 1958 to 1961, serving first with the Special Weapons Employment Group and then with the staff of the Commander in Chief U.S. Pacific Fleet. He returned to Washington for duty in the targeting shop of the Office of Naval Intelligence from 1961 to 1964. He became one of the first Integrated Operational Intelligence Center (IOIC) Supervisors aboard the USS SARATOGA (CVA 60) from 1964 to 1966. Returning to Washington, Captain Connell became Operations Officer and, later, Executive Officer of the Naval Reconnaissance and Technical Support Center.

From 1968 to 1970, Captain Connell served as Head, Reconnaissance and Indications (N-23), on the staff of the Commander in Chief U.S. Pacific Fleet. He was selected for the Naval War College and graduated in 1971. He then served for one year as the Edwin T. Layton Military Chair of Intelligence at the Naval War College before assuming command of Fleet Intelligence Center, Pacific in August 1972. After three years at FICPAC, Captain Connell has been assigned as Assistant Commander, Naval Intelligence Command (Operations) in Alexandria, Virginia.

Both Captain Connell and his wife are from Navy families. She is the former Betty Lou Wharton. They have three children; David 19, Gerald 17, and Leslie Ann 16.
