Subj: Possible Alternative Civilian Manpower Totals FY 1970

1. The Fiscal Year 1970 budget for the Naval Intelligence Command, which has now been submitted to the Secretary of Defense for review, contains 1,780 permanent full-time civilian positions, in accordance with Program Change Decision N-8-018. You have been advised in separate correspondence of the distribution of this end strength with associated man-years and dollars within the command.

2. The Office of Civilian Manpower Management (OCMM) has advised NIC-4 that it is preparing an alternative Navy position, in accordance with guidance received from the Secretary of Defense, which will include only 1,646 permanent full-time civilian positions for this command. It is entirely possible that the Secretary of Defense will approve this alternative total, which is 134 spaces less than the budget request. For your information, enclosure (1) shows how the reduction of 134 spaces would be spread within the command, on a percentage basis.

3. NIC-4 has supplied OCMM with a general impact statement, describing the effect of the reduction on the intelligence programs concerned. Before the intelligence budget hearings on 12-13 November 1968, however, more specific impact statements are needed from each addressee. Will you please supply such statements to NIC-4 by the close of business on 8 Nov 1968.
