

Procedure for Receiving Repatriated Naval Personnel.

1. Army and Navy will coordinate all action in connection with repatriation of service personnel.
2. It will be requested that all personnel be landed in a convenient Port of Embarkation. (FCS)
3. Bureau of Personnel will be advised of names and port of debarkation so that they may prepare requests for pay accounts, issue orders including leave and have a representative present after debarkation if they so desire. (See Annex # 221)
4. Army personnel will be transported to a nearby Fort. Navy personnel will be transported to the nearest Naval Air Station.
5. The Office of Naval Intelligence will be represented by an officer from 16-1-V and by such personnel from the appropriate Naval District as may be determined by the District Intelligence Officer after consultation with DNI.
6. 16-1-B will contact families or next of kin of repatriates for security briefing through the appropriate DIOs.
7. The District Intelligence Officer will be directed to:
 - (1) Arrange for debarkation at Army Port of Embarkation cooperating with Army.
 - (2) Furnish transportation to the Naval Air Station for interrogation, security briefing, quarters etc.
 - (3) Arrange for quarters at the Naval Air Station.
 - (4) Brief personnel on security and obtain signed statements on forms provided. Inform repatriates that wife, parents or next of kin have been notified of tentative arrival in U.S. and have been briefed.

- (5) Assist as necessary in procuring pay, changing foreign money to U. S. currency, and other financial matters.
- (6) Take temporary custody of foreign money, souvenirs and other personal possessions which would prove embarrassing to security.
- (7) Assist as necessary in processing orders, leave papers, transportation to destination etc.
- (8) Assist as necessary in interrogation and screening of repatriates.

8. ONI representative from 16-~~X~~-V^{and 16F} will conduct interrogation for technical and other intelligence as desired and will supervise the screening and select those desired for temporary duty in Washington utilizing Army facilities here.

9. It is contemplated that all repatriates will be held at the Naval Air Station for approximately four days after which those not required in Washington will be given orders including leave and will depart for home. Those required in Washington will be ordered to Washington for a period of not more than three days after which they will proceed as above. During the period when repatriates are held prior to departure on leave or for Washington they will necessarily be isolated.
