SUBJECT: Contact Register.

1. There is full and complete cooperation between D3 and CIG in Washington and also between New York Regional Office of CIG and DIO-3ND. DIO-3ND has turned over to CIG practically all Contact Register activity in New York City, excepting (a) special requests from ONI, and (b) continuing contacts with U.S. Flag Shipping Companies. All other Naval Districts are coordinating current CR operations with local Army Commands, pending the establishment of additional CIG regional offices.
2. Navy has backed and continues to back the CIG Central Contact Register plan to the limit, without reservations. DIO's have been instructed to that effect at all conferences, and are complying.
3. No complaints have been reported thus far from Navy contacts as to transfer to CIG of centralized control of ^{DIO-3ND} Contact Register operations. Nor has D3 heard of complaint from CIG.
4. So far as D3 is concerned, the traffic is one way, with no return from CIG to

Subject: CIG - ONI Relationship.

1. ONI is receiving approximately 675 reports per month from CIG, most of which are sent over on a voluntary dissemination basis. This number is gradually increasing.
2. Voluntary dissemination to CIG by ONI averages about 800 reports per month not including dispatches.
3. ONI sent 17 requests for reports to CIG in June. This number is about average. CIG fulfilled 15 of ONI's requests in June.
4. ONI received 26 requests from CIG and 22 requests were fulfilled.
5. Most of ONI's requests are for individual reports, few are for field projects. This is CIG's chief complaint relative to ONI.
6. ONI's chief complaints relative to CIG are:
