Subj: Delay in preferring charges, case of Private First Class Lee H.  
OSWALD 1653230 USMC

Ref: (a) Report of Investigation, Case 15-58, Criminal Investigation  
Section, Office of the Provost Marshal, MAG-11, NAS Atsugi, Japan

1. In the subject case, the delay in preferring charges was the result  
of the following factors:

a. Private First Class OSWALD was confined at the Naval Hospital  
Yokosuka, Japan undergoing treatment for the gunshot wound from 27 October  
1957 to 16 November 1957.

b. This organization was on extended field maneuvers from 18 November  
to 18 March 1958 during which time the investigation could not be handled  
by squadron personnel.

c. The Report of Investigation by the MAG-11 Provost Marshal (Ref:a)  
was not completed until 7 April 1958 and not received until 9 April 1958.

d. Office hours were held on 10 April 1958 and the Charge Sheet  
prepared on 11 April 1958.

2. During the period between the commission of the offense and his courts-  
martial Private First Class OSWALD was not subject to any disciplinary  
restraint and it is not considered that the delay resulted in any injustice.

I. Preliminary Statement

a. An informal investigation of the incident involving the injury sustained by Private Lee H. OSWALD was conducted as directed by reference (a).

b. The investigation commenced by informing Private OSWALD that he was designated a party to the investigation and by advising him of his rights as contained in paragraph 0304 of reference (b). Private OSWALD stated he wished to avail himself of his rights as a party and requested that his statement submitted previously to the Provost Marshal be included in this report. (See enclosure (7)).

c. The investigation was continued by an interview of the only person remaining in Marine Air Control Squadron-1 who was present when this incident occurred. This statement, and the statements previously taken of persons who were present at the time, and the memorandum from the Medical Officer to the Commanding Officer, Marine Air Control Squadron-1 are included as enclosures (3) through (6).

d. As a result of this investigation, the following facts are established:

(1) that Private OSWALD had in his possession a .22 caliber pistol of the derringer type and ammunition for same.

(2) That at or about 2030 on 27 October 1957 he was injured by the discharge of this weapon.

(x) That Private OSWALD's possession of this weapon and the ammunition was in violation of Article 91 UCMJ.

(4) That Private OSWALD was awarded a summary court martial on 11 April 1958 for violation of Article 91 UCMJ and found guilty, sentenced to reduction to Private, confinement at hard labor for a period of twenty (20) days, and to forfeit twenty-five (25.00) per month <sup>per month</sup> (See enclosure (2)).

2. Opinions:

a. That private OSWALD was injured, while removing an article from his locker, by accidentally knocking the (loaded) weapon to the deck where it discharged, the bullet striking him in the left elbow. (See enclosures (2), (3) and (4)).

b. That permanent partial disability may result from this injury. (See enclosure (4)).

c. That Private OSWALD's possession of the pistol and ammunition for same constitutes wrongful conduct in violation of a lawful regulation.

d. That, while Private OSWALD's conduct did constitute wrongful conduct, it did not constitute misconduct as defined in paragraph 0405 of reference (b).

e. That the injury was sustained in the line of duty as defined by paragraph 0405 of reference (b).

3. Recommendations:

a. That Private OSWALD, having been tried by a summary court martial and awarded punishment by same, not be subject to further disciplinary action.
