SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD

The official United States Marine Corps (USMC) Service record for Oswald contains a notation relating to Oswald's weapons qualifications to the effect that Oswald qualified in December, 1956, on the M-1 rifle with a score of 212. A notation after this score has been inserted which qualifies Oswald as an "mm" (Marksman).

Colonel Oscar T. Jensen, Jr., Military Secretary to the Commandant, USMC, advised Liaison on December 4, 1963, apparently there is an error in the conclusion that Oswald's score of 212 qualified him as a Marksman. Colonel Jensen stated that since 1953 a qualification score on the M-1 rifle over 210 results in the awarding of a Sharpshooters' badge. Colonel Jensen called the Marine Corps at San Diego, where Oswald underwent his basic training and was advised records for the pertinent period have long since been destroyed. Colonel Jensen researched dead files in the Washington Marine Corps Headquarters and verified that a score of over 210 in Course "A" for the M-1 rifle in 1956 would qualify the recruit for Sharpshooter rating.

On the basis of his research, Colonel Jensen concluded that there was an administrative error in the entry in Oswald's Service jacket indicating that for a score of 212, he was awarded recognition as a Marksman when in reality Oswald apparently earned the rating of Sharpshooter.
