Inspector Malley called from Dallas this morning to advise that Mrs. Oswald has been receiving numerous offers from the press and James Martin, who, out of sympathy, has been furnishing an apartment to Mrs. Oswald, has been acting as her manager.

Inspector Thomas Kelly of the Secret Service in Dallas advised today that Martin has been insistent on being permitted to talk to Mrs. Oswald and of making final arrangements so that she can capitalize on the press offers, one of which is in the amount of \$12,000. In view of Mrs. Oswald's difficulties with the English language, Nartin is desirous of utilizing George A. Bouhe, a Dallas resident who speaks Russian, in the arrangements. Malley advised that we have previously interviewed Bouhe who was an acquaintance of the Oswalds.

Inspector Kelly feels that Secret Service has no alternative but to agree to this arrangement as they do not feel they can continue to hold Mrs. Oswald for an extended period of time. Kelly asked our Dallas Office if we had any objection to this arrangement.

Malley said that he advised Kelly that this was a matter for the Secret Service to decide and he told Kelly that he thought Kelly should clear this with Secret Service Headquarters in Washington. Malley said he was furnishing the above for information in the event Secret Service should be in touch with us. I told Malley I was in agreement with his action; that this was a matter for Secret Service to handle and resolve.
