- 3. On May 14, 1942, subject requested a review of his case in a letter to the Regident Inspector of Reval Material at the Sparry Gyroscope Company, affirming his loyalty as an American citizen.
- The subject is known to be a Pascist agent on the basis of the following informations
  - (a) Subject, an American citizen of Italian birth, was formerly confidential secretary to Itale VERRANDO, of the Italian Line, New York City, and was a close confident of VERRANDO and Panlo CCCHIFINTI, Assistant Manager of the Line, until the entrance of the United States into the war.
  - (b) A confidential informant stated that subject violted Italy in January, 1941, returning to the United States by the way of Spain in April 1941, boaring with him the official secret orders of the Italian Coverment for the sabotage of Italian ships in United States Harbors, which occurred in May, 1941,
  - (c) This information is corroborated by telegrams and correspondence in the files of SINIONANO at the Italian Line offices, concerning full details of the arrangements made for SIRIGHARO's trip to Italy on Surgent business of the line". SINIGNANO'S files contain a telegrem ment in March, 1941 from the head of the Line in Genoe to VERRANDO stating that certain secret orders which could not be sent by cable would be handed to SIRIGHANO at Conon for transmittal to the United States.
