Subject: Unsatisfactory cooperative arrangements with Federal Agencies.

Reference: (a) Com. 11 conf. 1tr. ND11/A3-2, (A6-Bn), Serial I-290, of August 14, 1940.

- 1. In reference (a), the Commandant presents his military responsibilities and points out certain unsatisfactory arrangements in obtaining from other Federal Agencies first-hand information on suspects and possible saboteurs.
- 2. Until Jume, 1939, Investigating Units of Federal Agencies operated independently to a large extent, with limited exchange between Agencies. In order to coordinate information on activities involving espionage, counter-espionage and substage, a directive was issued by the President that all Federal Agencies other than the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Military Intelligence Division and the Office of Maval Intelligence, would refer innediately to the nearest F.B.I. Office all information bearing on these activities. In order to delimit the functions of the three Agencies, an agreement was made, included in basic letter as reference (a). Present conditions show the desirability of centralizing all information under one Federal Agency with permanent personnel. Thus there is but one clearing house into which information of interest flows and is coordinated, not only from all Federal Agencies, but from lawenforcement agencies and patriotic groups.
- Intelligence of the Eleventh Naval District are known to be most complete and comprehensive due to the seal and ability of the present District Intelligence Officer and his predecessors. With important interests both to the Fleet and Shore Establishments located within the Eleventh Naval District, full information must be made available. To insure this, this point was discussed at a recent conference at the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The Federal Bureau of Investigation assured this Offices that instructions had been issued and would be reissued to their Field Offices that full information on cases of any possible or probable Naval interest must be immediately turned over to the District Intelligence Officers. With this cooperation, there appears to be no apparent used of filling files with information unless there is definitely a Naval interest.
