- In order to prevent duplication of effort and to assure proper coordination of subject investigations, the Directors of Naval Intelligence, Federal Bureau of Investigation and Military Intelligence Division of the War Department, signed an agreement, enclosure (A), delimiting their responsibility.
- In reference (d), the Acting Secretary of the Navy approved the agreement, enclosure (A).
- Enclosure (A) is forwarded for the guidance of District Intelligence Officers in connection with all investigations of espionage, counterespionage, and sabotage.
- Attention is called to the fact that both reference (a) and the terms of enclosure (A) call for close cooperation between the three agencies in all fields.
