- l. Enclosure (A) to reference (a) deals with precautions to be taken by naval personnel in the event of falling into the hands of the enemy. It is felt than under ordinary circumstances the instructions covered by Reference (a) are sufficient to prevent the disclosure of information by prisoners of war.
- 2. Circumstances may, however, arise during major operations where prisoners of war are subjected to strong duress by their captors with a view to extracting information of immediate value. Intelligence recently obtained in these Headquarters furnishes an example where three exciator prisoners of war imparted information of considerable importance to the Japanese. While it is not known how or under what circumstances the prisoners in question gave the information, the fact remains that intelligence was made available in such fashion as to allow timely counter-measures to be taken by the Japanese, if desired.
- The disclosure of intelligence by the captured flyers mentioned in Paragraph 2 suggests either (a) lack of proper indectrination, or (b) information obtained by the enemy under duress. It is believed that further indectrination and instruction of all flying personnel engaged in major operations will to a large extent obviate the leakage of valuable information. It is, therefore, considered essential that steps be taken immediately further to impress upon all personnel concerned what attitude should be adopted when captured by the Japanese, and to make certain that they are, before probable combat, theroughly and recently familiar with the enclosure of Reference (a).



- 4. Proper indoctrination concerning the conduct of prisoners of war when strong duress is applied by a ruthless enemy is one of considerable difficulty. It is believed, however, that careful briefing of personnel with regard to information which may be imparted to the enemy only as a last resort will to a great extent lessen the danger of disclosure of valuable intelligence.
- 5. It is not believed desirable to lay down rules of an inflexible nature in this regard. In briefing pilots and members of their crows, however, it is suggested that Task Force Commanders be guided by the situation as of the time of the operation, and that information which may be disclosed under the conditions envisaged above should be uniform for all personnel involved. The information so imparted must necessarily sound plausible, and should be uniform in so far as all hands are concerned. It need not necessarily be correct and should, if practicable, constitute information which will in fact tend to deceive the enemy rather than assist him, particularly during the early phases of an operation.
- 6. In order to insure that the enemy does not obtain important information regarding future plans and communication intelligence, officers and enlisted personnel having detailed knowledge of these should not be sent on combat missions over enemy territory. Plane crows on such missions should be given only such information as they need to know to carry out the mission.
