On November 14, 1941, a representative of G-2, Panama Canal Department, and a representative of the Fifteenth Naval District Intelligence Officer, together with the Chief of the Civil Intelligence Section, Panama Canal, conferred for the purpose of determining which of various suspicious individuals in Panama should be first apprehended for internment when such a measure is effected.

In considering the various suspicious persons whose names should constitute the proposed lists, the following factors were taken into account:

(a) All Japanese should be interned immediately.

(c) Several individuals whom it was considered should be interned as soon as possible were passed over in order to comply with subparagraph (b) above, because they are unable to suddenly depart or go into hiding and could be easily apprehended in a later round-up.

5. Attention is invited to the fact that the primary responsibility for all arrangements incident to apprehending suspects for internment, as well as the actual apprehension suspects in this area with the Commanding General, Panama Canal Department.
