Subj: Administrative Discharge Procedures

Ref: (a) Pers F-3b Memorandum of 28 April 1972

1. In accordance with the request set forth in reference (a), the Naval Investigative Service gathered available statistics relative to the amount of time required to investigate self-admitted narcotics and homosexual offenders. Records show that during the period 15 December 1971 through 30 April 1972, this Service completed four hundred and thirty-five (435) investigations pertaining to self-admitted narcotics and homosexual offenses. The average time necessary to complete the investigation and have appropriate documentation forwarded to the requesting command was 3.173 days.

2. The twenty additional NIS Agents have played a significant part in reducing the investigative time needed to complete these cases. However, other factors, such as the Exemption Program, have had an impact on the overall caseload and have made it possible to keep the time factor below the 10 - 12 days completion time which was projected initially.
