1. The problem of sabotage is one of gravest importance requiring immediate consideration and speedy action. The keypoint in any defense against sabotage is the employee, because it is through him that the saboteur prefers to work.

2. To assist in warding off any possible menace of sabotage from within, it is advisable to inform employees of this danger. Enclosure (A) is forwarded for this purpose. It is directed that each employee be furnished a copy of this pamphlet.

3. By reference (a) each navy yard was informed that a supply of these pamphlets would be received by them directly from the publisher.
